Introduction to IGHS

Founded in 2006 under the Ikubunkan Institute of Education, Ikubunkan Global High School (IGHS) is a private co-educational school serving Grades 10-12, with an optional Grade 11 study abroad program. Accredited by Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) and bilingual in English and Japanese, IGHS is located in Bunkyo City, Tokyo, near the University of Tokyo and other leading institutions. Its motto, "Choose your path from the World Map," reflects the school's commitment to helping students build internationally minded futures.

Admissions & Student Population

Admission to IGHS is based on entrance examinations and internal progression from its affiliated junior high school program. Total enrollment is approximately 250 students, including 45 students in the graduating Class of 2027.

Curriculum & English-Medium Instruction

IGHS aims to foster the holistic development of students as globally minded learners, equipping them with the perspective and resilience to navigate a changing world. Its socio-scientific curriculum, informed by current issues and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, fosters broad perspectives and strong problem-solving skills.

This approach is supported by a distinctive English-medium program:

- Liberal Arts Track:** Selected classes are taught by international teachers in an English-speaking environment.
- Honors Track:** All major academic subjects, except Japanese, are taught in English. In Japanese classes, handouts and assessments are provided in both English and Japanese to support student comprehension, particularly for international students.

2026-27 Subject Offerings and Graduation Requirements

In accordance with Japan's national curriculum, students complete approximately 100 credits for graduation. Requirements vary by academic track and may include credits earned through the optional Grade 11 study abroad program.

Grading System & Ranking

IGHS uses an unweighted 1-5 GPA scale aligned with the American letter-grade system. Grades are awarded using a relative grading system, meaning that final grade distributions are determined in relation to overall class performance rather than fixed absolute score thresholds. For students who participate in the optional Grade 11 study abroad program, cumulative GPA is calculated based on performance in Grades 10 and 12 only.

Provisional GPA Distribution (Quintiles) - Class of 2027

Rather than assigning traditional class rank, IGHS reports GPA distribution quintiles to more accurately reflect its flexible curriculum. Quintile bands are based on cohort rank order and may vary slightly in size to avoid splitting tied GPAs. Current quintiles are based on Grade 10 performance. Updated quintiles will be reported on transcripts at the end of Semester 1 (July 2027).

Overseas Programs

Classes of 2027 & 2028

Through the Class of 2028, all IGHS students participate in a mandatory one-year study abroad program during Grade 11. Students in the **Liberal Arts Track** study abroad in Canada or New Zealand, while students in the **Honors Track** study abroad in the United States.



From the Class of 2029

Beginning with the Class of 2029, IGHS will offer greater flexibility in its overseas programming:

- Liberal Arts Track:** Students will choose either a one-year study abroad program in Canada or New Zealand, **or** short-term overseas programs in the United States plus either Rwanda or Bangladesh.



- Honors Track:** Students will have the option either to study abroad in the United States for one year or to remain in Japan. Those who remain in Japan will be encouraged to participate in short-term overseas programs.



School Year Structure

IGHS follows a specialized academic calendar based on Japan's standard April-March school year. The calendar is designed to support the school's academic program, including optional second-year study abroad and other overseas learning opportunities.

Students participating in the optional second-year study abroad program typically depart in January and return in December.

Applied Learning & SDG Engagement

IGHS integrates service learning, research, and social innovation across both the Liberal Arts and Honors Tracks, with academic credit and cross-curricular connections embedded in each program. Guided by the motto "**Collaborate, Innovate, Elevate,**" these experiences foster research, critical thinking, problem-solving, and civic engagement through inquiry and action connected to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



Both tracks culminate in capstone projects through which students communicate their learning and findings in formats such as reports and posters. Students are also encouraged to participate in external projects and opportunities that extend their learning beyond the classroom.

- Liberal Arts Track:** Students are organized into seven specialized research labs, where they pursue individual research themes with academic guidance and opportunities for collaboration with universities and companies. Through study abroad, global field experiences, and the school's ARISE system, students deepen their learning, reflect on their development, and build the skills needed to contribute meaningfully in a global society.
- Honors Track:** Students pursue TASK projects, which allow them to follow individualized pathways generally grouped into three areas: **Performance, Social Sciences, and Natural Sciences.** Through active, practice-based learning, students conduct literature reviews, seek guidance from mentors, collaborate on projects, engage in fieldwork with external stakeholders, and pursue inquiry connected to the SDGs, building independence, teamwork, and real-world competencies.

University Entrance

IGHS graduates pursue diverse postsecondary pathways and matriculate to universities in Japan and around the world. Each year, students receive offers from globally recognized institutions as well as selective national, public, and private universities across Japan.
