English Immersion Program & Bilingual classes

IGHS provides a distinctive English immersion program for its students. English classes are instructed by native English teachers within an entirely English-speaking environment, complemented by select courses in both the Honors and Liberal Arts tracks.

In the Honors track, non-English classes are conducted as Bilingual classes, where the core instruction is delivered in Japanese. However, handouts and tests are provided in both English and Japanese languages to facilitate comprehensive understanding and learning.

Second Year Study Abroad

All IGHS students are required to partake in a transformative academic study abroad program during their second year, spanning almost the entirety of the academic year. Each student is assigned to their own institution abroad, where stringent rules and regulations ensure both their academic focus and safety. Separate guidelines govern social media usage and the use of Japanese language is strictly prohibited. This, coupled with the initial experience of solitude, compels students to navigate and conquer a variety of challenges, fostering significant personal growth.

Collaborative Seminars

IGHS, guided by the ethos of "Collaborate, Innovate, Elevate" offers dynamic student-led "collaborative seminars" aimed at fostering a holistic education. These seminars empower students to develop a broad spectrum of liberal arts skills while honing their capacity for critical thinking, problem identification, and solution crafting. The collaborative seminars, jointly conducted by first-year and third-year high school students, encompass eight diverse themes listed below.

Each seminar delves deep into its respective subject matter. Students assume active roles in these sessions, driving practical learning experiences by engaging with collaborators and leveraging their individual insights into prevailing issues.

Throughout the academic year, students engage in collaborative group work and immersive fieldwork with external stakeholders, equipping them with invaluable teamwork abilities and real-world competencies essential for active participation in society.

All students are tasked with engaging in exploration activities and individual research as integral components of their collaborative seminars. Their aim is to produce objective results aligned with the specific targets outlined by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Academist

IGHS collaborates with external academics through a platform called Academist to assist students with their research. Esteemed young researchers from renowned institutions such as the University of Tokyo, Kyoto University, and Hokkaido University provide direct guidance to students at IGHS. Through this ongoing partnership, students have been able to learn specialized knowledge and theories from these excellent researchers, further developing their activities and research.

University Entrance

IGHS graduates pursue diverse paths, gaining admission to a wide array of universities both in Japan and abroad. Each year, a substantial number of students secure placements in prestigious global institutions, alongside admission to esteemed public and selective private universities within Japan. Over the past six years, 222 of our students have pursued studies abroad in 17 different countries. Among them, 29 students have earned acceptance into the Top 100, with 56 achieving placement within the Top 200 of the THE World University Rankings. Additionally, several alumni have ventured into overseas medical schools, contributing to their expanding presence and impact across the globe.

Dual Diploma Program (Honors Track)

The Dual Diploma Program (DDP) is a collaborative initiative with Wayland Academy, a distinguished prep school in the United States. As part of this program, students engage in online classes, supplemented by credits earned during their second-year study abroad in the U.S. This comprehensive approach allows students to obtain dual high school diplomas—one from Japan and the other from the U.S—thereby facilitating their university applications abroad with greater ease compared to solely possessing a Japanese high school diploma.

Aptitude and Proficiency Testing (Honors Track)

All Honors students must take SATs and IELTS annually in order to assess general aptitude and English proficiency, as well as to support their university applications. In the future, we are aiming to introduce Advanced Placement (AP) tests as well.
